

## Comparison of Michigan to the United States

For the 24 indicators where Michigan can be compared with the U.S., Michigan is better than the nation on nine and the nation is better than Michigan on four. There is little difference between the U.S. rate and the Michigan rate for adequate level of prenatal care; adolescent use of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs; alcohol-induced deaths; childhood immunization; cancer deaths; chronic liver disease and cirrhosis deaths; homicides; kidney disease deaths; overweight; pneumonia and influenza deaths; and stroke deaths.
